Fall greeting to all of you!

Many of you may be aware that I will be leaving in a few days to serve as the Spiritual Director for a women's Walk to Emmaus retreat weekend. This will be held at Skye Farm, one of our outstanding United Methodist campgrounds. There will be worship and learning, eating and fellowship, and s'mores around the campfire.

But one of the best gifts of "retreating" - or getting away from your everyday responsibilities - is often the chance to enjoy silent times. In the quiet times, bodies get rested. In stillness, you can better consider how satisfied you are with your life. And when you are open and waiting in your soul, God will draw near.

I have been re-reading one of my favorite small books this summer called "Stories of Prayer for a Healthy Soul". I want to share some of the things that I have read and enjoyed, in hopes that they might bless you as they have me.

"Listen and hear my voice; pay attention and hear what I say." Isaiah 28:23

" A spiritual life requires discipline because we need to learn to listen to God, who constantly speaks but whom we seldom hear. When, however, we learn to listen, our lives become obedient lives. The word "obedient" comes from the Latin word audire, which means "listening." Jesus' life was a life of obedience. He was always listening to the Father, always attentive to his voice, always alert for his directions. Jesus was "all ear. "That is true prayer: being all ear for God. In a few weeks, we will carry the Gospel message "to the ends of the earth"! #### **Redbird Mission Collection Begins**

The Mission team at Endwell United Methodist Church is again coordinating the collection and delivery of shoeboxes for the Red Bird Mission, located in Beverly, Kentucky. The Red Bird Missionary Conference is one of three United Methodist missionary conferences in the United States. It is the most comprehensive mission effort of the United Methodist Church, providing outreach and services that minister to the whole person (spiritual, physical, social, and economic).



In December of 2018, four volunteers drove two 26-foot trucks to the mission in Kentucky. They transported over 2,700 shoeboxes, over 60 bedspreads, 110 sheet sets. 300 bags of clothing, as well as numerous books, school supplies, and cleaning supplies.

The need is even greater this year. Our goal for 2019 is to transport at least 3,600 shoeboxes and other supplies to the Red Bird Mission the first week of December. We are asking participating churches to drop off their filled shoeboxes to one of two locations: **The Upper New York Conference Center**, located at 7481 Henry Clay Boulevard in Liverpool or the **Endwell United Methodist Church**, located at 3301 Watson Boulevard in Endwell between November 1<sup>st</sup> and November 26<sup>th</sup>. Also, arrangements to have items picked up can be made by e-mailing Dave at <u>Dalexander4@stny.rr.com</u> or you can drop off your items at a church in your District. We are looking for churches in the Upper New York Conference that are willing to be collection sites for their respective districts. If your church is willing to be a collection site, please e-mail Dave and your district office. A storage site in Endwell, New York has been secured to store items for the trip. We have already received over 70 shoeboxes and numerous bags of clothing.

There are two different styles of shoeboxes-adult and children. Items needed for the adult shoeboxes include: a comb or brush, shampoo, hand lotion, deodorant, a toothbrush and toothpaste, chap stick, a full size bar of soap, a washcloth, disposable razors, shaving cream, nail care supplies, socks, a pair of work gloves or mittens, and a winter hat or scarf.

Items needed for children's shoeboxes include: two or three small toys, two or three items needed for school, a comb or brush, shampoo, hand lotion, a child's toothbrush and toothpaste, chap stick, a bar of soap, a washcloth, a small flashlight, socks, a pair of mittens, and a winter hat. Christian bookmarks, wristbands, and other spiritual items are also appreciated.

The Red Bird Mission would like the items put in **clear**, **plastic** shoebox sized storage containers with locking lids. Please **do not wrap** the boxes. They would like the boxes **labeled** with the intended recipientman, woman, boy, or girl. The mission also needs **new** pillows, **new** bedspreads, **new** sheet sets and **new** blankets for full and twin beds, and **new** bath towels. Books, school supplies, toys, and cleaning supplies are also in need.

Donations of money can be made payable to the Endwell United Methodist Church to help cover the cost of the truck rental, fuel, and lodging and meals for the volunteers who will deliver the shoeboxes and other donations to the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky the first week in December. All funds will be deposited into a dedicated account for this mission. A suggested donation is at least \$1 per shoebox. Please <u>do not put</u> <u>money inside the shoeboxes</u>. Place the money in an envelope and attach it to the shoebox.
