Autumn Greetings to all,

I take great delight in this season when maple leaves display their vibrant colors, the air is crisper, and creatures scurry about preparing to hibernate. I feel energized in autumn, always ready to take a walk and enjoy the glory of God's Creation. When the frigid temps, snow, ice and sleet of winter come along, I am not at all ready (or willing) to take walks.

I was musing about that this week when I came across a reading called "Walking 101 for Christians". I have read through it more than once now, finding it to be a simple but solid reminder of what my life, and yours, is meant to be about as followers of Jesus. (This reading comes from Knowing God 101: A Guide to Theology in Plain Language, p.238, by Bruce Bickeland Stan Jantz.)

"Walking is basic. We aren't instructed to fly through the Christian life; we aren't told to dash or even jog. It's a walk - slow, steady, deliberate, and doable. If God had wanted something more flamboyant or drastic, God could have arranged it.

Walking has a beginning. Start at point A. For us, that's at the point of inviting Jesus Christ to be our Savior. A person who is brand new in Christ knows little about him, but that is where we all have to start.

Walking requires effort. Your mind can think about walking, but unless your leg muscles go to work, you aren't going to budge. The same principle applies in walking the Christian life. Want progress? Then you'll need to expend some energy.

Walking takes you on a journey. Once you harness your energy, you start moving closer to where you want to go. Maturity will not happen all at once; you learn and grow day by day. It is a process.

Walking takes you to a destination. When you walk, you get someplace. A Christian's destination is to become like Christ. In the process of getting to our destination, we will glorify and enjoy God and be used by him for good in His world."

This kind of walking, moving forward on my spiritual journey - now that is

something I am very excited to do all year long. You won't see me out walking around Juniper Drive much when winter settles in - nope! But you can find me nestled inside my home - or down the road at the Ballston Spa UM Church, hopefully with several of you, sharing in the journey together, growing closer to God.

Community Supports the 13th Annual Falling Leaves 5K Charity Run ---- In Excess of \$7,000 to be Donated to Veterans & Community Housing Coalition
