Warm Greetings,

The teachers and I had a meeting on January 6^{th.} Here are some of the highlights:

We are continuing with the Whirl curriculum but placing an emphasis each week on the following basic skills some of which your children may already know:

Media Team in Action

Last fall we assembled a group of people who have an interest in the church's use of all forms of media (Web, Face book, video, audio): Dave Edwards, Khai Gibbs, Karen Groff, Mark Warner, and the pastor. After some preliminary discussion & dreaming, we decided to investigate whether the audio/video experience in the sanctuary could be enhanced.

Recently we had a meeting with a local audio/video consultant who works with many churches in the area; he made a number of recommendations and provided cost estimates for each system. This information was shared with Church Council at the January meeting. We are currently working to schedule presentations from at least 2 other providers to get the fullest possible picture of what our options are in terms of equipment and cost.

The consultant also made some suggestions about how we could improve our sound quality in the short term, which have been implemented and seem to us to have some benefit. He also pointed out that the lavaliere microphone currently in use is operating on a frequency which is now reserved by law for emergency vehicles, so we have discontinued use of that mike effective immediately.

We'll keep the congregation posted on our progress, but if there are questions in the meantime, please feel free to direct them to any of the team members listed above.
