Greetings, Church Family,

As the month of March begins the church starts to prepare for the holy season we call Lent. This is a 7-week period when we examine our lives, repent of our sins, and seek to renew and strengthen our lives as followers of Jesus Christ. Here are some coming events that I hope you will participate in:

Ash Wednesday service is on March 6th from 6:30 to 7 pm in the sanctuary. Listen to Scripture and music; those who wish may receive ashes as a sign of repentance.

A Lenten (small-group) class will be held in the Connection Cafe for 6 Sundays, from 8:45 to 9:35. We'll listen to a 5 to 7-minute opening video and then share in group discussion. District News

At this time, our attendees include Pastor Kelly Warner, Ruth Persons, and Linda Sheeran. Pastor Kelly will be teaching two workshops: How to be a Savvy SPRC and Opening the Gates to Giving.

Annual Conference: Two Meanings!

An annual conference is a unique geographic area of The United Methodist Church. Each annual conference is assigned a bishop and elects volunteer leadership for the conference. The annual conference session is the annual meeting of the lay and clergy members of that geographical area. This meeting sets direction and budget for the area, and the bishop appoints clergy members to their place of service for the next year.

General Conference

Every four years all the annual conferences of the United States, along with the central and missionary conferences, meet together to review and enact new legislation or approve new initiatives of the The United Methodist Church. The General Conference enacts legislation and speaks for the church. The Council of Bishops oversees the life of the church based upon the legislation passed by the General Conference. The Judicial Council ensures our work remains in agreement with our Constitution. These actions may have direct impact on the ministry of the local congregation through changes to the policy of The United Methodist Church as documented in The Book of Discipline and The Book of Resolutions. This conference is held in the years divisible by four (2016, 2020, 2024...). The year before, each annual conference elects lay and clergy delegates to represent them at General Conference.

Special Session of General Conference

In February 2019, The United Methodist Church will hold a <u>special session of General Conference</u>, something that has only <u>happened once before</u> in our 50 year history. Our bishops called this gathering, at the request of the 2016 General Conference, to help us find a way forward through our deep disagreements about same-sex marriage and the ordination of LGBTQ clergy.

At the time of this writing, February 23-26, our delegates are gathering in St. Louis, Missouri. Results of this conference will be announced and publicized.

Preparing Food from "Safe Church"

Whether it is preparing potluck dinners, lunch for the daycare or a meal for a charitable fundraiser, various church employees and/or volunteers can be found in the kitchen preparing and serving meals. Even though these employees and/or volunteers have the best intentions when preparing or serving food, an accidental oversight could cause a massive case of food poisoning. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate that every year approximately 76 million people in the United States become ill from harmful bacteria in food. Of these, about 5,000 die. To minimize food risks some of the following should be kept in mind:

Preparing Tips

- Only use foods before the "use by" date.
- Wash your hands with warm, soapy water for 20 seconds before and after handling food
- Wash fruits and vegetables with cold water before using. There is no need to wash or rinse meat or poultry.
- Wash cutting boards, dishes, utensils, and countertops with hot, soapy water before and in between using each food item.
- Use one cutting board for produce and a separate board for meat and poultry to reduce the risk of salmonella and other bacteria causing illnesses. Using different color cutting boards for different food items will help reduce cross contamination.
- Separate raw, cooked, and ready-to-eat foods while shopping, preparing, or storing. Never place cooked food on a plate that previously held raw meat, poultry, or seafood.
- Keep juices from different food items from mixing.
- Marinate meat, seafood, and poultry in the refrigerator in a covered, non-metallic container.
- To properly thaw frozen meat, it's best to plan for slow, safe thawing in the refrigerator. Allow about one day for every five pounds of meat to thaw in the refrigerator.
- Many people assume that if a hamburger is brown in the middle, it is done. However, looking at the color and texture of food is not enough – you have to use a food thermometer to be sure. According to USDA research, one out of every four hamburgers turns brown before it reaches a safe internal temperature. The only safe way to know if

meat, poultry and egg dishes are done is to use a food thermometer. Below are USDA recommended safe minimum internal temperatures:

Egg dishes – 160 degrees Fahrenheit Fish – 145 degrees Fahrenheit Ground beef – 160 degrees Fahrenheit Pork – 160 degrees Fahrenheit Poultry, whole and chicken breasts – 165 degrees Fahrenheit Steaks and roasts – 145 degrees Fahrenheit


