Greetings in the great name of Jesus,



The 10 Commandments of Food

A January World Economic Forum session on how food choices can become a catalyst for positive change became an opportunity for World Council of Churches general secretary Rev. Dr. Olav Fykse Tveit to present "Ten Commandments" of food to the gathered business and political leaders.

"If we view food through the lens of justice, every plate of food reminds us of certain challenges and opportunities. It is important that we acknowledge the efforts, investments and very lives of living plants and creatures sacrificed to provide food on our tables," reflected Tveit after the event.

Tveit's ten commandments of food are:

- 1. You shall give thanks for the food you eat.
- 2. You shall provide food for those who have no food.
- 3. You shall eat mindfully and in moderation.

4. You shall be grateful to those who grow and prepare food for your table.

- 5. You shall not waste food.
- 6. You shall reduce the ecological footprint of food production and supply.

7. You shall protect the biodiversity of the sources of food.

8. You shall support fair wages for farmers' efforts. 9. You shall strive for all people to have access to affordable and nutritious food.

10. You shall rejoice and share the sacred gift of food with all.

Tveit added: "Food is sacred, as it is a gift of God to sustain our lives through sharing, celebration, gratitude, sacrifice and renewal. In our common home — the Earth — we have to work together to limit climate change and other barriers to food security so that food can be made available to all today and in the years to come.

Rev. Adam Hamilton nominated to President Obama's Advisory Council on Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships

Rev. Adam Hamilton, senior, and founding, pastor at The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kan. (the largest United Methodist Church in the US) and celebrated author, will also be the guest Bible study leader at the 2016 sessions of the Upper New York Annual Conference.

Reverend Hamilton is the author of 23 books, including *Making Sense of the Bible*. Reverend Hamilton speaks on leadership across the country and in 2013, he delivered the sermon at the Inaugural Prayer Service held at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. Reverend Hamilton received a B.A. from Oral Roberts University and an M.Div from Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University.

What is a Covenant Discipleship small group?

Jesus chose a small group of 12 to start His ministry when He was 30 years old. They met daily, prayed and studied OT as Jesus often referred to those Scriptures. Mainly He spoke His Father's words as He never did or said anything that His Father was not doing or saying. He had an intimately deep, deep relationship with His Dad. (We call Him "Heavenly Father", but I think He loves to be called "Dad" as well). The Disciples hung onto His words and asked many questions. It was obvious to them that this man, who tapped them on the shoulder, one at a time and said "Come, follow Me" was not only a man full of power but definitely a man with a new and exhilarating message! Remember that only one betrayed Him! 11 handpicked sinners, with souls not unlike our own, lived a life of surrender so that you and I could have the privilege of studying the scriptures, learning to pray God's word, coming together with our Bibles in small groups to share our lives, the good and the not so good things that all sinners fight through on a daily basis. Our soul is made up of our mind, our will and our emotions. Yes, we do need each other to help us walk uprightly with Jesus. Wesley's question to work through at meetings was: How is it with your soul? Looking into the Bible for answers was how these first Methodists ministered to each other, bringing their spiritual gifts to help each other grow in grace after grace. I understand this to be our walk of "Sanctification" with God. So "How is it with your soul?

John Wesley embraced the "small group" example that Jesus set forth in the Gospels and then, low and behold, as the number of groups were increased the Wesley brothers became the founders of the Methodist Church here in America. If you ever get to Georgia, go to the coast and visit St Simon Island. Huge monuments to John and Charles Wesley and a small Anglican Church (now called Episcopal) with stained glass windows of John and Charles with Bibles in hand. Before the church was built, John and Charles preached under the Live Oaks, huge spreading trees giving a lot of shade. I'm sure the shade felt wonderful in Georgia temperatures for the worshipers who loved God and each other so many years ago.

As some of you know, I have led a small group called "Healthy Living Bible Study" off and on for the last three years. We have made some wonderful friendships among us. We have a woman from the Galway UMC that is in our once a month Covenant Discipleship group that meets at my house now since we finished the study we were doing together at our church. Susan will now become a small group leader in her church and the Sanctification process (I like to call it "Cooperating with God to be more like Jesus") will continue and Disciples will be empowered to "Make Disciples For the Transformation of the World". You all will recognize that as the Mission Statement of the United Methodist Church.

I will be starting a "Singles Group" probably in April. It will start as a small group with just 3 meetings before June. We will be studying Judges 13 – 16. Why those Chapters? I'm glad you asked. We will have the opportunity to go to the Sight and Sound Millennium Theatre in Lancaster, PA near the end of May. This year's production is "Samson". Those 4 Chapters of the Old Testament are the story of Samson. Knowing the story, with all the details, will help us to enjoy the performance, both drama and music. This will be my 7th trip to this theatre. Yes, I love their performances. The Bible does literally come alive on stage. The Wade bus trip is two days with one overnight in Lancaster. Let me know ASAP if you want to get in on this trip. I will be making the reservations as soon as you let me know. The dates for the trip are: Monday and Tuesday, May 23 and 24. I am rooming with a Burnt Hills friend. We have been in several small Discipleship groups together over the years.

FINANCE REPORT

When speaking of March, many people like to say, "in like a lion and out like a lamb," but the weather we've had this year may support saying, "in like a lamb and out like a lamb." The blessing here is that we've saved on fuel costs and, as of this writing, we have incurred no snow removal costs. This has enabled us to stay within our spending plan. We anticipate saving many hundreds of dollars merely as a result of the weather.


The name of March comes from Latin *Martius*, the first month of the earliest Roman calendar. It was named for Mars, the Roman god of war and agriculture. His month was the beginning of the growing season. Martius remained the first month of the Roman calendar until 153 BC and several religious observances in the first half of the month were originally new year's celebrations. Great Britain and its colonies continued to use March 25 as the first day of the year until 1752 when they adopted the Gregorian calendar.

This year, in Ballston Spa, March 25th will be Good Friday. If you have also adopted the Gregorian calendar, you celebrated New Year's Day more than 2 months ago, but you may still be putting together the remnants of 2015 in the form of tax documents and vowing to be better organized with your 2016 tax paperwork. The answer is VANCO! My sincerest thanks to those of you who are current in your pledges, whatever method you use. However, I recommend VANCO to everyone because it makes accounting so much easier for the Church.

To those of you who have not explored use of VANCO, it is an automatic, pre-scheduled withdrawal of a set amount of your tithe from a designated account of your choice (savings, checking, etc.). You get a monthly statement and at tax time, you get a tax statement. You can get the statement for your tax preparer or, if you do your own taxes, you have all the information you need on your Church donations. No more flipping through your checkbook and digging through piles of papers, hoping you saved the right thing.

Many employers now require automatic deposit of wages, so you may already be familiar with the process. If your money is automatically going into your account, think about having your tithe come out automatically too and save yourself the time and trouble of writing an extra check. You'll thank yourself at tax time. It's a change I made and it's one I recommend, regardless of when you celebrate the new year.
