

FINANCE CORNER

May is the fifth month of the Gregorian Calendar and it is named for Maia, a Roman goddess. In our culture, we tend to think of the coming of May as the end of winter. April showers bring May flowers and for BSUMC, the end of the first financial quarter. For this year, we are faced with the loss of our current Pastor so there are additional factors to consider. When pastor transitions take place, it is not unusual for congregants to leave and we are experiencing some of that at this point. Having said that, we also can hope to anticipate a slow but steady increase in our weekly attendance over the next several months, with some effort on our part, as new people come to hear the new pastor.

The recent decline in attendance has had a negative impact on the operating income and expenditure plan. After the first quarter, we find ourselves about \$3,500 in the red for the current fiscal year. This is not particularly alarming at present because we anticipate that the upcoming fund raising efforts, as well as an anticipated decrease in pastoral salary and health insurance expenses, will help us to maintain a reasonably healthy bottom line. However, it is important that we recuperate during this transition and renew our efforts to do God's will in our church and in our community.

On another positive note, through the 1st quarter, our church has spent about \$2,400 on benevolences.
