



Finance Corner

October is the month that allows us some breathing room between the rush of getting children back to school and the rush of preparing for the holiday season. Leaves are changing color and like the author of Hebrews advises, let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Ch. 12:1. From the perspective of the Finance Committee, this means we should all take a look at our Annual Pledges to consider where we are as we enter the final accounting quarter of the year. We are ending a summer when vacation absences might have meant a missed weekly donation. You can check the status of your tithe account with Heather Leggieri if you have any questions. This might also be a good time to consider signing up for VANCO, the automatic account withdrawal system for your weekly offering. It will simplify your Sunday mornings and your recordkeeping. With regard to Church finances, current to the end of the end of August, we show a shortfall of approximately \$7,000 for the 2015 calendar year. This can be explained, in part, because of particularly low attendance numbers during the summer and the usual drop in income for summer months. Some of this income will be made up over the coming months as people meet their pledge obligations and attendance increases as the holidays approach. Moreover, we are hoping that the annual Stewardship Campaign, which begins in September, will remind everyone again of their tithing obligations.

The words are from an old Swedish poem written by Rev. Carl Boberg in 1886. He wrote it after being caught in a midday thunderstorm with awe-inspiring flashes of lighting followed by bright sunshine and the calm tweeting of birds singing that the storm was over.

Boberg fell to this knees in awe of God's greatness and wrote a poem. Several years later he was at a church and was surprised to hear his poem sung to an old Swedish melody. The beautiful hymn has since gone around the world inspiring many of God's greatness and wonder.
